We continue your continued efforts to support our community and those impacted by food shortages!



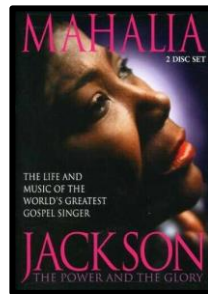
### Goldtimers at Fratelli's Ristorante!
